CHALLENGE

Classroom organization.

EXPLANATION

It is very easy for students with dyspraxia to get distracted.

ADAPTATION

It's often beneficial to place students with dyspraxia at the **first front rows** of the classroom where they can have **an easier view of the board**. It will be also easier to concentrate when sit distanced from doors, windows, bulletins and other classroom distractions.

Being next to near to class teacher, so that he/she is available to help if necessary is important but they can also be supported by well-motivated and sympathetic classmate.

For younger children make sure the student's feet rest on the floor, adding a small stool if needed. This will give him/her better stability and allow him to better control his actions.
