Although the main focus will be on foreign language learning, we will provide any language teachers with the necessary information and instruction, as well as templates and inspirations, to adapt the materials and methodology to any other language that is taught as a second (or third) language. The lesson plans will offer language teachers with ways to help their students practice grammar, vocabulary, idioms, etc. as well as all language skills (reading, writing, listening and speaking). All these activities will be presented in such a way that the students will not have the feeling of "working on grammar" but rather enjoying (hi)stories about cultural and historical heritage and fostering other important skills as well.
